A COMMUNITY-OWNED PUB FOR MARSTON?

The Thorold Arms closed in July this year and seems to have been repossessed by the bank. It is now up for sale on the open market (for £250,000). We want to re-open it, especially the pub, shop and restaurant and have it as a thriving business which underpins our lovely village.

We might only now be realising how much we miss having the pub and shop. We have the opportunity to get it back. Already over 60 households in the surrounding villages have emailed their support.

At the moment anyone or any company could buy it, including housing developers. Once it is in private ownership, our say in how it is used is dramatically reduced. We may be limited to objecting to a planning application for change of use from a business to a residential premises. Instead of a central, friendly, welcoming meeting place and service, it could be turned into housing. In order to guarantee that it is not used as anything other than a pub / restaurant / shop, we need to see if there is sufficient interest, motivation and (unfortunately) funding.
